

Arranging a Survey

When you are ready for a survey please contact us to discuss your requirements. Please take time to read through our 'Survey Contract' ([LINK](#)) and 'Terms of Survey' ([LINK](#)) which explain the scope of the survey. We require the necessary details in the written contract to be completed and returned to us prior to undertaking the survey.

Before we arrive to undertake the survey please make arrangements (with the owner/broker) to have the vessel lifted out of the water on the day of the survey and have the hull washed. It is usually the purchasing party who is responsible for the incurred costs of lifting and launching the vessel.

Depending upon the size of the vessel the survey of the underwater area will take approximately 2 hours.

When surveying fibre glass vessels, a longer time ashore may be required to assess moisture reading. This does depend on the age and material of the vessel. Please contact our surveyor to discuss this further.

When carrying out pre-purchase surveys, sample areas of the ant-fouling are removed to inspect the hull. The client should check with the owner or broker if any special coatings have been applied (such an epoxy) so that these are not damaged. It is the responsibility of the client to re-instate the anti-fouling.

We aim to have the report sent to you within 7 days of completion of the survey. The report will be sent by post and email.
